What happens when a singer with a wonderful voice records a collection of stunning old songs? The answer can be found on Gretchen Peters' new release. Here the talented singer-songwriter sings her favourite Mickey Newbury songs.

Country music singer-songwriter Mickey Newbury departed in 2002. He began his career in the late 60s. His first album featured the country classic Funny, Familiar, Forgotten Feelings, a Mickey Newbury that has been recorded by Don Gibson, Engelbert Humperdinck, Tom Jones and others. Mickey Newbury's best known track was An American Trilogy which was written in 1972 and became a big hit for Elvis Presley. Neither of those songs made it onto Gretchen Peters' album. Lets listen to the ones that are.

The album starts with the folky drama of The Sailor. The song features a piano, steel guitar and a strong vocal. Plus through the entire album we get a crystal-clear, superior production from Gretchen Peters and her husband. The songs spring to life. She

Even Woke Me Up To Sav Goodbye is one of Mickey Newbury's more country tracks. There have been numerous versions of this song. One of the best is a live version by Lee Ann Womack. This and Ronnie Milsap's superb hit version are on YouTube.

Sadly we have just lost Kenny Rogers. The First Edition. That song Just Dropped In (To See What Condition My Condition Was In) was penned by Mickey Newbury. It still classic. Gretchen Peters takes it at a slower pace, it's more subdued but it's loaded with atmosphere. The late-at-night, breathy vocal works well. Clearly a lot of thought has gone into this superior cover version.

San Francisco Mabel Joy is one of Newbury's best known songs. The track dates back to 1971. It has been recorded by many singers including Kenny Rogers, singer Joan Baez. The song with its rich, evocative lyrics is a classic, telling the story of "a Way Cross Georgia farm boy". Gretchen Peters' version is stunning. She seems to feel every well-written word. The steel quitar and high-quality production drips passion and turns this track into one of the great cover versions of recent years.

is The Night You Wrote That Song, one of Mickey Newbury's lesser-known songs. It's a cracker of a country song. Gretchen Peters imbues the track with a warmth and style that only great singers can manage. This is another track with wonderful lyrics.

Gretchen Peters' album closes with Mickey Newbury's tribute to songwriting legend Stephen Foster, Three Bells For Stephen. Stephen Foster wrote classic songs like Oh! Susanna and My Old Kentucky Home. The simple piano-led arrangement works well. Gretchen Peters delivers another
